Code of Conduct Complaint: Timothy Limbrick

Dear Mr Ali

Please regard this letter as an official code of conduct complaint against Timothy Limbrick.

I have been aware for some time that there are untrue rumours about me circulating on our housing estate. In particular there are rumours that I acted badly in my role as Chair of the RA, and also that I had ignored the constitution of the RA.


Until recently I had no 'proof' of what these rumours were, however yesterday I received a document by email which detailed 2 of the rumours that have been propagated. These were as follows:

1. That [Roger Jones] held a meeting with the developers of 30 Minories, in your capacity as Chair of the Residents Association, This was done without consultation with or the agreement of the committee.
2. That [Roger Jones] contacted the City grants team, again in your capacity as Chair of the RA about funding. In that communication, you suggested that they should only deal with the RA for funding purposes on the estate, and not consider applications from other groups. Again, this was done without consultation with or the agreement of the committee.

Unfortunately the items above, along with other allegations, are now taken as 'fact' by a group who have been campaigning to oust me as Chair, who are also spreading these rumours throughout the estate.

So in short – my complaint is that false allegations have been made by Timothy Limbrick, these have been adopted by a small activist group who have then spread these false allegations to the estate in general. This has contributed to a hostile atmosphere in our committee WhatsApp group where other members of the group repeat these slanders, to such an extent that I felt that I had to leave the group, as well as the estate WhatsApp group, as these lies and the continued wider propagation, was having an effect on my mental health.
